2016 Maintenance Fees

2016 maintenance fee invoices have been included with your newsletter. The decision of the Board, at their October meeting was to keep the maintenance fees at \$410.00. Please remember that the maintenance fees fund the operation, improvement and upkeep of the Resort. We ask that you pay your fees in a timely manner. The first portion is due January 1, 2016 and the second half is due in April 1, 2016

Last year, the Board conducted an Amenities Study requesting input from the owners. The most requested upgrade to the Resort was for Wi-Fi throughout the Resort. 77% of the responses asked for this improvement. This popular amenity will soon become a reality for Unicoi Springs.

Other comments and concerns were to increase the inventory in the camp store, upgrading of the putt putt, playground and tennis courts. There were numerous requests for more group activities.

All of these improvements make our

resort more desirable and marketable resulting in additional ownerships, increased revenue and affordable maintenance fees.

We have the resources to make Unicoi Springs Camp Resort THE premier camping resort in Northeast Georgia and the country if we apply the principle of fairness, equity and benefit to every owner. Temporary Winter Storage

Effective November 1, 2015 winter RV storage will be available at \$32.50 per month for campers with no electric availability. Golf carts will be stored for \$10.00 per month with no electric. The location will be determined by the Maintenance

Manager. This determination will be based on work projects on-going in the winter months.

In addition to the RV storage fee, there is a \$15.00 fee each time maintenance has to hook to your camper to move it into storage and back out at the end of the storage period.

The campers and golf carts must be removed from Winter Temporary Storage by March 1, 2016 without exception.

Facelift and Updates for Resort

In addition to the winter improvements you read about in our March newsletter, our amazing maintenance crew managed to upgrade Sites 8, 24, 136, 178, 211 and 250 during the camping season.

The proposed budget for 2016 has been approved. The Finance Advisory Committee and the Board of Directors are in agreement that Unicoi Springs needs sprucing up in

several other areas.

As you come and go, watch for the ongoing beautification progress in the following areas: the front entrance, the Clubhouse lawn and sidewalks, the Holey Board area, miniature golf and playground, the tennis courts and Pickle Ball. Road repair in Area 1 (behind the Club house) will be a welcome improvement. throughout the entire Resort will

also include a phone upgrade for the Office and four more rentals will be replaced with new units. You will soon see some additional handicap parking for golf carts behind the Lower Pool Bathroom. We are excited to make these improvements to our already beautiful resort and hope you are too.

No Winter Shutdown for 2016

There has been an ongoing, long-time debate about closing the Resort during the harsh winter months versus leaving it open the entire year. In the winter of 2000, a survey was taken of owners to address this question.

At that time, the owners answered with a majority vote to close during the winter. Since that time, the conversation has continued each year. At a recent Board Meeting, a motion was made and passed to keep the Resort open all 12 months of 2016 with the intention of

doing an actual study as to cost, practicality and usage. Close scrutiny will prevail during this time period and the issue will be revisited prior to the 2017 camping season.

Effective November 1, 2015, only Area 1 (Sites 1 - 49), Area 5 (Sites 225 -274) and Area 6 (Sites 275 - 316) will remain open for camping. Effective January 1, 2016, only Area 5 will remain open. On March 1, 2016, the entire resort will reopen up for the new camping season.

The Office will be open seven days a week from 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. and reservations will be taken, as usual, from 9:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. daily) The Laundry, Activity **Building and Clubhouse** will be open except for scheduled deep cleanings.

Inclement weather will be addressed as it happens. It goes without saying that our guests should prepare their campers for cold weather comfort and safety.

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Off-Season Rental Rates Offered

During the months of November, and December, 2015, January, February and March, 2016, owners and their guests will be given discounted seasonal rates on rentals.

The trailers, which are normally \$50.00 nightly will be \$35.00 per

night. The cabins will be \$50.00 per week night and \$60.00 on Friday and Saturday during this time .

If 7 days or more are booked, in a cabin, the cost would be \$50.00 for each night. A single weekend night in a cabin would cost \$70.00; a single

weekend night in a trailer would cost \$45.00.
