Personal Post Office Boxes for Owners

The volume of mail and packages being sent to owners in care of the Resort has increased substantially. The post office does not pick up or deliver to us. The staff picks up the large volume of busi-

ness mail daily. Owners who are here on a regular basis are required to purchase a personal post office box and retain responsibility for their own mail. The cost of a post office box is \$4.00

per month with an initial \$6.00 key deposit for 2 keys. Note: Most orders to Amazon are now sent to the post office for pickup even if you are providing the physical address.

Why Is My Internet Not Working??? (Please Read)

Since we have acquired our resort wide Wi-Fi service, the majority of you are thrilled beyond belief to have this long-awaited service. However, the Office receives occasional calls from owners whose connection is difficult to obtain and or intermittent dropping of the connection. They are frustrated and can't believe that we spent the money for this service that "just doesn't work".

Once we started getting this type of call, we contacted our representative from Gunby Communications to assist us in pinpointing the problem. Fortunately, for us, the support from this company is immediate. They can remote in prior to even visiting the Resort and have amazing technology to pinpoint any issues.

Here is an excerpt from information we have posted in the Clubhouse in regard to the use of the Wi-Fi

"These are some simple guidelines and tips that you, as campers, can utilize to make the internet system work better.

First of all, the Wi-Fi system was designed to make it usable to all campers in all locations. The stations that distribute the internet are placed in strategic locations to reach all campsites. If you look near your campsite, find the access point that is closest to you, and associate your devices to that access point. All the access sites are numbered.

Second, while you may see a full signal coming from the access point on your device, keep in mind that the signal coming from your device is not going to be as strong as the signal you receive. The antenna distributing the Wi-Fi has much more power than the one on any device

you have. Also, most campers are constructed with a lot of aluminum so when you are inside your camper, the camper itself will sometimes block the signal coming from your devices inside.

There are some solutions that you can use to make your internet perform better. Wi-Fi extenders are relatively cheap and work well with our system. Some come with a small antenna that sticks to the window and boosts the signal inside. We DO NOT recommend using a booster connected to another wireless router. In that case you are simply broadcasting more radio waves that distort the signal for you and your neighbors. ALSO, if you have or are using a jetpack or similar cellular device to receive internet connected to a wireless router in your camper, please TURN DOWN the power of your wireless router. In that case you are interfering with your neighbors' ability to use the campground Wi-Fi system."

In a nutshell, if you are having a problem with your Wi-Fi, there is a very good chance that one or more of your neighbors is still using their own hotspot or router. The intention is not malicious; many are not even aware that they are causing problems in their area. Often this individual may believe that if we have Wi-Fi in the park and it is strong, adding their own Wi-Fi makes their connection even stronger. In this case, more is not better.

If you want to amplify the strength of your connection, you can purchase a Wi-Fi extender, as mentioned in the Guidelines, however; this extender will not override the hotspots and personal rout-

ers being used in your area.

Our Wi-Fi system has 13 access points delivering 40 mgs of service which is more than adequate for the volume required, even on the busiest weekends. Overall, the system we installed is performing correctly and there are an average of 125 to 200 devices daily connected. Gunby Communications has more than 400 accounts of this caliber. The same issue happens to all of them. The solution to the problem is simply education and consideration of your fellow owners. You can actually see for yourself if someone in your area is using an extra and personal connection device. When the Unicoi Springs access points appear for your choice to click for your connection, any personal ones will also show up on that list.

This is your opportunity to speak with your neighbor and explain the complications and that our system will work without them using valuable minutes or spending extra money while they are here in the Resort. This conversation should be both friendly and beneficial from one owner to another.

Remember, this great service is very new to everyone and not everyone understands the ramifications of this simple step. Let's help each other, you may even strike up a new friendship in the process.

The Office will make this information available to owners and guest checking in. If we work together in this endeavor, everyone will benefit.

Golf Cart Parking Alert

If you are paying for golf cart storage, you know that you are paying for a designated spot to park your cart. When you prepare to leave the park, it is your right to assume that your space will be vacant until you return to put your cart back in place.

Nothing is more frustrating than to see that someone has parked their golf cart in your spot or parking over the line when you are packed, ready to go and probably on a time schedule. The dilemma is finding out who parked in your spot or taking the easy way out and parking in the next vacant spot. Not only are carts being parked in the wrong designated spot, they are being parked in such a way that they are taking up more than one space which compounds the problem.

At some point, these decisions will come home to roost and someone will not be able to park their cart at all. So begins another "domino effect" that eats up precious time for an owner and/or staff to unravel who parked

where and why so that the carts can be organized the way they should be. Due to the fact that this problem is still occurring, the Board has passed a motion to charge a \$20.00 fine when this happens in the future. There is a warning posted in the area.

In consideration of others and for the sake of your pocketbook, please use diligence in parking your golf cart in the assigned space and make sure that your owner number is visible even if the cart is covered.
